There are 14 government-funded Employment Ontario service providers (EO) and 4 York Region Employment Centres in York Region, Bradford and West Gwillimbury to assist you, the employer in accessing these wage and training subsidies by helping you with:

- Hassle-free contract administration and timely payment of financial incentives.

UP TO \$6,000 PER
EMPLOYEE

FINANCIAL INCENTIVE:

EMPLOYEE SALARY
VIA EI BENEFITS

Hire an unemployed job seeker to gain new skills and work experience while working on a new business project that benefits the community and local economy. The employee's salary will be subsidized by EI benefits for up to 52 weeks.

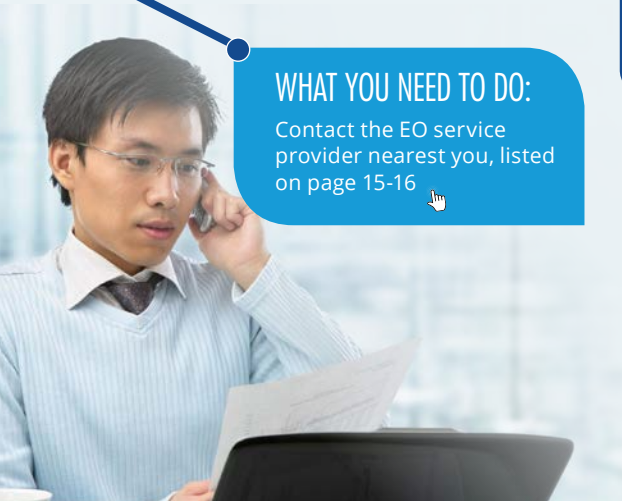
FINANCIAL INCENTIVE:

WILL VARY DEPENDING
ON THE PROJECT

Employers or employer associations can apply for funding to assist in developing and implementing strategies for dealing with labour force adjustments and meeting human resource requirements.

FINANCIAL INCENTIVE:

A matching contribution funding of up to \$80,000 per year as a wage subsidy for a maximum of 2 years

YORK REGION EMPLOYER SERVICES PROGRAM

THE PROGRAM OFFERS EMPLOYERS:

- Job-ready employees who are pre-screened and matched to jobs at no cost
- A financial incentive to offset training costs
- Job-posting services through York Region Employment Resource Centres at no cost
- Human resources supports for an employee's first six months on the job
- Customized training to meet workplace needs
- Coverage of Workplace Safety and Insurance Board (WSIB) claims for the employee for six months

HIRING YOUTH & NEW GRADUATES



FINANCIAL INCENTIVE:

Portion of wages, amount to be determined

Small & Medium Enterprises (SME's) can share a portion of the salary costs to hire post-secondary science, engineering, technology, business or liberal arts graduates for a period of 6-12 months.

FINANCIAL INCENTIVE:

A maximum cost of \$20,000 per project regardless of the length of the intervention

Amounts needed to accommodate participants with disabilities would be in addition to the \$20,000 maximum.

Hire a post-secondary graduate for minimum 3 months in a field with a high demand for workers. You could get funding to hire youths if you can give them useful work experience.

FINANCIAL INCENTIVE:

50% of total eligible costs, up to a maximum of \$20,000 in matching funds

Hire recent graduates in agriculture, agri-food science and veterinary medicine for at least 4 months and up to 12 months. Only 80 agricultural internships are available for Canadian graduates.

Accepting applications between October 1, 2015 and November 15, 2015 for projects beginning on or after April 1, 2016.

FINANCIAL INCENTIVE:

Wage subsidies of 33% of an intern's salary up to \$12,000

Hire a young professional for a full-time position in a field related to the environment, including environmental protection, resource management, and sustainability.

FINANCIAL INCENTIVE:

Funding up to \$50,000 to hire and train youth between the ages of 15 and 30

Hire youth facing barriers to employment for projects that last up to 30 weeks. Projects can be either local or regional and youth should be registered with this program.

HIRING SUMMER STUDENTS

NOTE: The application period is between the months of December and January

SUMMER JOBS SERVICE



FINANCIAL INCENTIVE:

\$2-PER-HOUR, PER STUDENT

Hire a summer student who is returning to school in the fall.

FINANCIAL INCENTIVE:

UP TO 50% OF THE PROVINCIAL MINIMUM WAGE, PER STUDENT

Companies with 50 or fewer employees can hire a summer student who is returning to school in the fall.

HIRING PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES



FINANCIAL INCENTIVE:

Wage subsidy, rates vary

Diversify your workforce with job-ready employees who are eager to contribute. Ongoing assistance provided to both employer and employee.

FINANCIAL INCENTIVE:

Wage subsidy for the first 15 weeks of employment at \$11/hour; employer reimbursed for 24 hours of the week

Provide minimum 30+ hours of employment per week for candidates who are ready for entry-level positions. Ongoing assistance provided to both employer and employee.

FINANCIAL INCENTIVE:

APPRENTICESHIP



FINANCIAL INCENTIVE:

\$2,000 EMPLOYMENT SIGNING BONUS

The \$2,000 Employment Signing Bonus encourages employers in the trades to register new apprentices in sectors where there is a high demand for skilled workers.

FINANCIAL INCENTIVE:

A TAX CREDIT EQUAL TO 10% OF THE ELIGIBLE SALARIES AND WAGES

A tax credit equal to 10% of the eligible salaries and wages payable to eligible apprentices in respect of employment after May 1, 2006. The maximum credit is \$2,000 per year for each eligible apprentice

FINANCIAL INCENTIVE:

MAXIMUM CREDIT FOR EACH APPRENTICESHIP IS \$5,000 PER YEAR

Qualifying businesses can claim 25 per cent of eligible expenditures (30 per cent for small businesses) made during the first 36 months of an apprenticeship program that commenced on or after April 24, 2015. The maximum credit for each apprenticeship is \$5,000 per year. The maximum credit over the first 36-month period of the apprenticeship is \$15,000.

FINANCIAL INCENTIVE:

\$1000 TAXABLE CASH GRANT FOR EACH APPRENTICE THEY EMPLOY AND TRAIN

Employers can earn a \$1000 taxable cash grant for each apprentice they employ and train who completes his or her apprenticeship, receives a Certificate of Apprenticeship and where applicable, a Certificate of Qualification.

Employers that can provide supervision and a training structure in the skilled trades, can be matched with a pre-screened apprentice.

TRAINING



FINANCIAL INCENTIVE:

A REFUNDABLE TAX CREDIT OF UP TO \$3,000

Hire an Ontario student enrolled in a co-operative education program at a recognized Ontario university or college for a minimum of 10 weeks, up to a maximum of four months.

FINANCIAL INCENTIVE:

UP TO \$10,000 PER EMPLOYEE

Pay one-third of the training costs, delivered by an eligible third-party trainer, to train your staff on the skills they need.

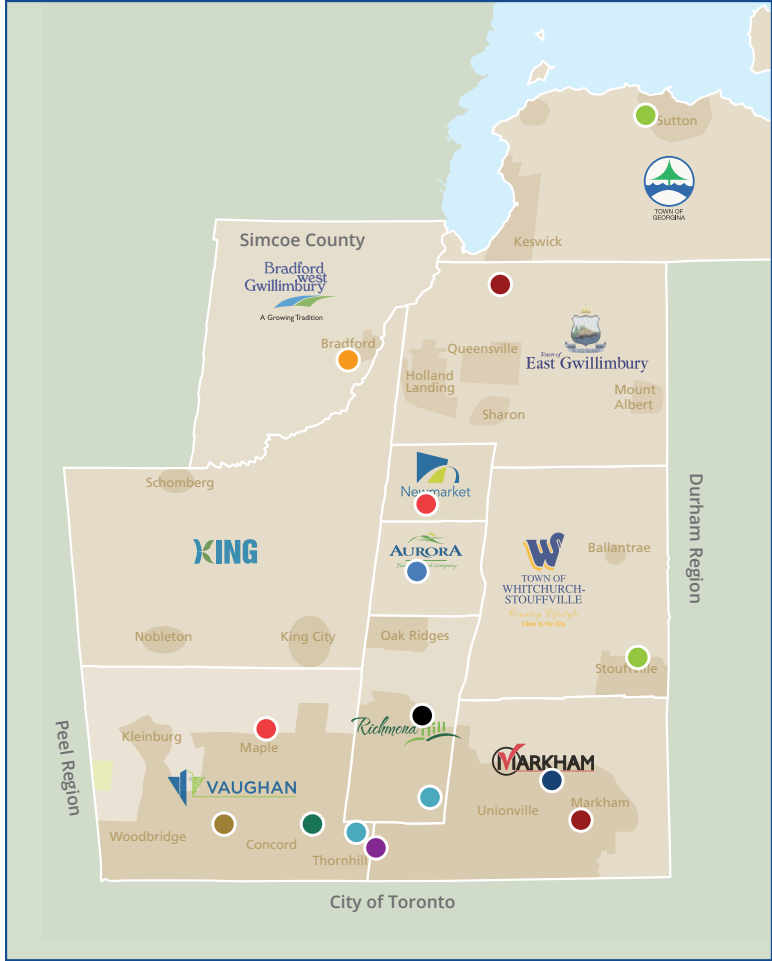
